Scenario

History:

A 61-year-old patient attends a new patient clinic for restorative rehabilitation planning.

Presenting complaint:

Main concern is increasing difficulty in terms of chewing food. Patient would also like, if possible, to improve the aesthetics; but at present function is the bigger issue.

History of presenting complaint

Ongoing issues of tooth wear and difficulty eating. Also had various attempts at replacing the maxillary left central incisor but none have been effective long-term.

Dental history:

Intermittent dental attender. Sporadic brushing with no interdental cleaning performed.

Medical history:

Past smoker, stopped 20 years ago. Original habit 10-15 cigarette a day for about 20 years.

Occasional acid reflux, but no active treatment.

Social history:

Works as a farmer in a busy dairy farm.

Clinical examination:

Extra oral

Loss of lower face height evident. **Intra oral:** Oral hygiene fair. Some plaque deposits at gingival margin but no subgingival calculus deposits detectable. Some restorations in disrepair.
